

Co-op recalls Breaded Cod Fillets due to undeclared allergens

Co-op is recalling its Breaded Cod Fillets because some packs may have been incorrectly packed with battered fillets containing mustard and milk which are not mentioned on the label. This means the product is a possible health risk for anyone with an allergy to mustard and/or an allergy or intolerance to milk or milk constituents.

Risk statement

Allergen(s): Mustard, Milk

This product contains mustard and milk making it a possible health risk for anyone with an allergy to mustard and/or allergy or intolerance to milk or milk constituents.

Action taken by the company Co-op is recalling the above product from customers and has been advised to contact the relevant allergy support organisations, which will tell their members about the recall. The company has issued a point-of-sale notice to its customers. These notices explain to customers why the product is being recalled and tell them what to do if they have bought the products. Our advice to consumers If you have bought the above product and have an allergy to mustard or an allergy or intolerance to milk or milk constituents, do not eat it. Instead return it to the store from where it was bought for a full refund.

About allergy alerts

Sometimes there will be a problem with a food product that means it should not be sold. Then it might be 'withdrawn' (taken off the shelves) or 'recalled' (when customers are asked to return the product). Sometimes foods have to be withdrawn or recalled if there is a risk to consumers because the allergy labelling is missing or incorrect or if there is any other food allergy risk. When there is a food allergy risk, the FSA will issue an Allergy Alert.
