Your business can get advice on:

- tax
- writing a business plan
- finance
- business premises and business rates

You may have other responsibilities depending on what your food business does.

Make sure you check:

- licences or permits for example to sell food or to trade in the street
- insurance
- your employees have the right to work in the UK. All employers in the UK have a responsibility to prevent illegal working. You do this by conducting simple <u>right to work checks</u> before you employ someone.

There are also rules you must follow if you're:

- selling food online
- importing and exporting food
- <u>storing or using personal information</u> this applies to information kept on staff, customers and account holders
