

## New appointments to the FSA Board

Clare Evans, Dr Susan Paterson, and Steve Ruddy will serve four-year terms, and Professor Sir Frank Atherton, Alison Austin and Louise Hoste and will serve three-year terms.

Professor <u>Sir Frank Atherton</u> has held senior public health leadership roles across England, Canada, and Wales over two decades, culminating in his service as Chief Medical Officer for Wales during the Covid-19 pandemic.
