This means the product is a possible health risk for anyone with an allergy or intolerance to milk or milk constituents, an allergy to hazelnuts, (nuts) and/or soya, and/or an allergy or intolerance to wheat or gluten, or with coeliac disease. The affected products were sold by T J Morris at Home Bargains.

About allergy alerts

Sometimes there will be a problem with a food product that means it should not be sold.
