Spartan Protein is recalling various products because they contain milk, oat (gluten), peanuts and soya which are not emphasised on the label. This means the products are a possible health risk for anyone with an allergy or intolerance to milk or milk constituents, oats or gluten or an allergy to peanuts or soya.

## Risk statement

These products contain milk, oats (gluten), peanuts and soya. This means the products are a possible health risk for anyone with an allergy or intolerance to milk or milk constituents, oats or gluten or an allergy to peanuts or soya.

## **Action taken by the company**

Spartan Protein is recalling the above products from customers and has been advised to contact the relevant allergy support organisations which will tell their members about the recall. The company has also issued a point-of-sale notice to its customers. These notices explain to customers why the products are being recalled and tells them what to do if they have bought the products. ## **Our advice to consumers**

If you have bought the above products and have an allergy or intolerance to milk or milk constituents or oats or gluten, allergy to peanut or soya, do not eat them. Instead return them to the store from where they were bought for a full refund.

## **About allergy alerts**

Sometimes there will be a problem with a food product that means it should not be sold. Then it might be 'withdrawn' (taken off the shelves) or 'recalled' (when customers are asked to return the product). Sometimes foods have to be withdrawn or recalled if there is a risk to consumers because the allergy labelling is missing or incorrect or if there is any other food allergy risk. When there is a food allergy risk, the FSA will issue an Allergy Alert.
