Technical information about this website's accessibility

The Food Standards Agency is committed to making its website accessible, in accordance with the Public Sector Bodies (Websites and Mobile Applications) (No. 2) Accessibility Regulations 2018.

Compliance status

This website is partially compliant with the [Web Content Accessibility Guidelines version 2.1](#) AA standard, due to the non-compliances and exemptions listed below.

Non-accessible content

This online training has been developed using a learning management system (LMS) and an authoring tool. A combination of both systems allows users a greater learning experience of the module lessons whilst allowing navigational ease across the site.

Currently there are some known issues within the authoring tool which means it does not comply entirely with WCAG 2.1 AA standards. However, the FSA has made the service as accessible as possible, for example:

- Using only radio buttons or true/false questions to allow screen reader users to know which answer has been selected.
- Removing content which may distract some users
- Replacing interactions with icons and text
- All images to have alt tags
- An accessible transcript is provided for each module.

The content listed below is non-accessible for the following reasons.

Non-compliance with the accessibility regulations

The content that is non-accessible is outlined below:

- The start module button at the beginning of each learning resource is not currently recognised as a button by screen readers. (WCAG 2.1 AA, 2.5.5 Target size)
- Some pages do not allow the pinch and zoom function on the resource pages. This appears to apply to some android mobile phones only. (WCAG 2.1 AA, 1.4.10 Reflow)

The software provider has recently completed an update to the website in attempt to resolve these issues. The platform is currently under review to measure the effectiveness of these changes, this statement will be updated to reflect the results in due course.

Disproportionate burden

At this time, we have not made any disproportionate burden claims.

Content that's not within the scope of the accessibility regulations

At this time, we have not identified any content that is not within scope of the accessibility regulations.

Preparation of this accessibility statement

This statement was prepared on 11 September 2020 and last reviewing and updated on 4 April 2022.

The software provider has recently completed an update to the website in attempt to resolve these issues. The platform is currently under review to measure the effectiveness of these changes and we hope to resolve the outstanding issues in due course.

We tested the service based on a user's ability to complete key journeys. All parts of the chosen journeys were tested, including documents.
