Technical information about this website's accessibility

Compliance status

This website is partially compliant with the [Web Content Accessibility Guidelines version 2.1](#) AA standard, due to the non-compliances and exemptions listed below.

Non-accessible content

This online training has been developed using a learning management system (LMS) and an authoring tool. A combination of both systems allows users a greater learning experience of the module lessons whilst allowing navigational ease across the site.

Currently there are some known issues within the authoring tool which means it does not comply entirely with WCAG 2.1 standards. However, the FSA has made the service as accessible as possible, for example:

- Using only radio buttons or true/false questions to allow screen reader users to know which answer has been selected.
- Removing content which may distract some users
- Replacing interactions with icons and text
- All images to have alt tags
- An accessible transcript is provided for each module.

The content listed below is non-accessible for the following reasons.

Non-compliance with the accessibility regulations

The content that is non-accessible is outlined below:

- There are non-interactive components which are included in the tab order on the modules. We do not anticipate this should prevent anyone completing the training, however this may be frustrating for users not using a mouse.
- The Page up and Page down voice commands function at the initial survey make the view go all the way to the bottom or top of the page and you may need to navigate through the page using an alternative method, e.g. mouse, trackball, keyboard.

Disproportionate burden

At this time, we have not made any disproportionate burden claims.

Preparation of this accessibility statement

This statement was prepared on 11 September 2020.

Some testing was carried out internally by the Food Standards Agency and we also consulted with an independent external accessibility expert for advice.

We tested the service based on a user's ability to complete key journeys. All parts of the chosen journeys were tested, including documents.
