We have also asked stakeholders to consider whether the term 'less than thoroughly cooked' should be replaced by a simpler term such as rare, pink or lightly cooked. The outcome of the consultation will be provided to the Board later on this year. Work on triggers to monitor and provide assurances that controls are being applied effectively has begun and we plan to provide feedback to the Board later this year.
