With baseline and ambition included in the graphs.
Action 2 Performance and Resources Report FSA 18-06-16	Chris Hitchen to confirm the movement of ratings within the FHRS scheme.	September 2018	Chris Hitchen  Individual business tracking is difficult with the tools currently at our disposal, as in some circumstances LAs may re-use business identifiers. Some businesses may stay in the 0 – 2 rated bracket for some time, others may drop into that having previously been rated 3 or above. Generally, the movement is between 3 – 5 ratings.  The Enhanced Registration, as part of the Regulating our Future (RoF) programme will make it easier for the FSA to draw more detailed analysis of FBO scores, including movement in hygiene ratings. The general movement trend is included in the Performance and Resource report and as further data becomes available through RoF implementation we will gain more granular detail

			<p>which will gives us a fuller picture of an FBO's record including their trend in FHRS scores. FHRS scores are an ambition (not target) for FSA (and LAs), and whilst we show leadership, food safety and hygiene is the responsibility of the food business. The LAs continue to be the CA and are responsible for carrying out interventions and enforcement locally – the balanced scorecard is improving assurance on LA performance.</p>
