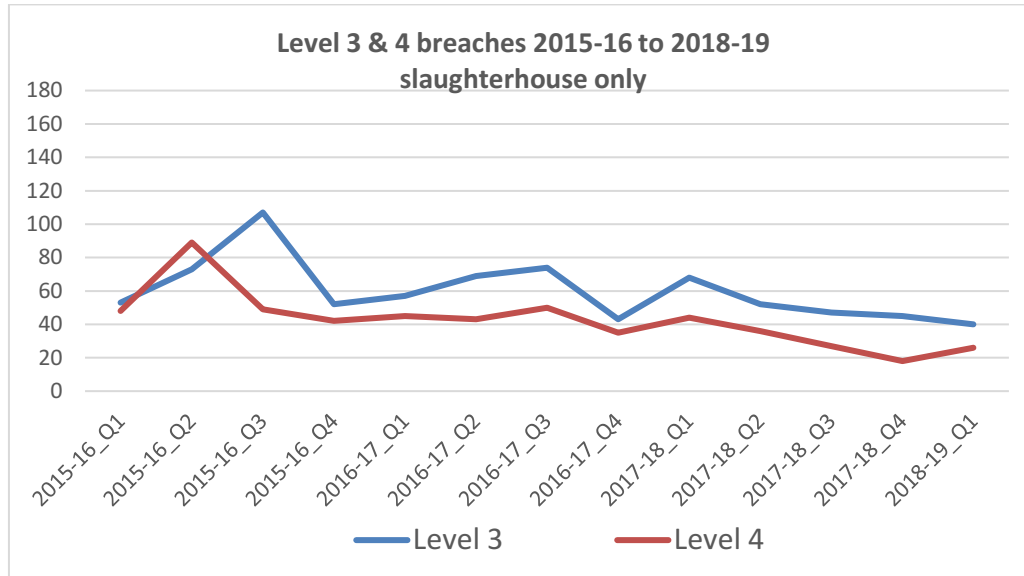

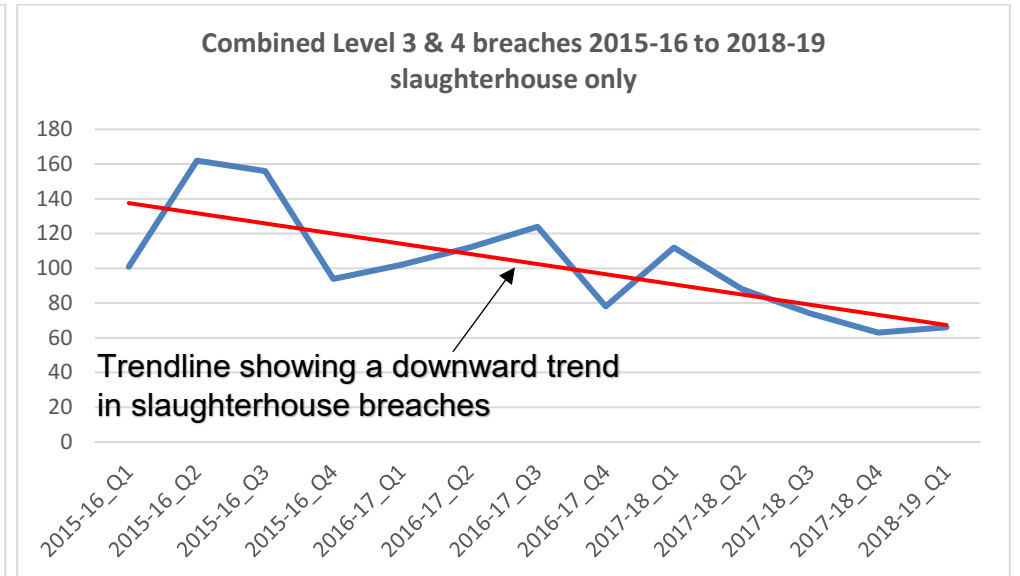

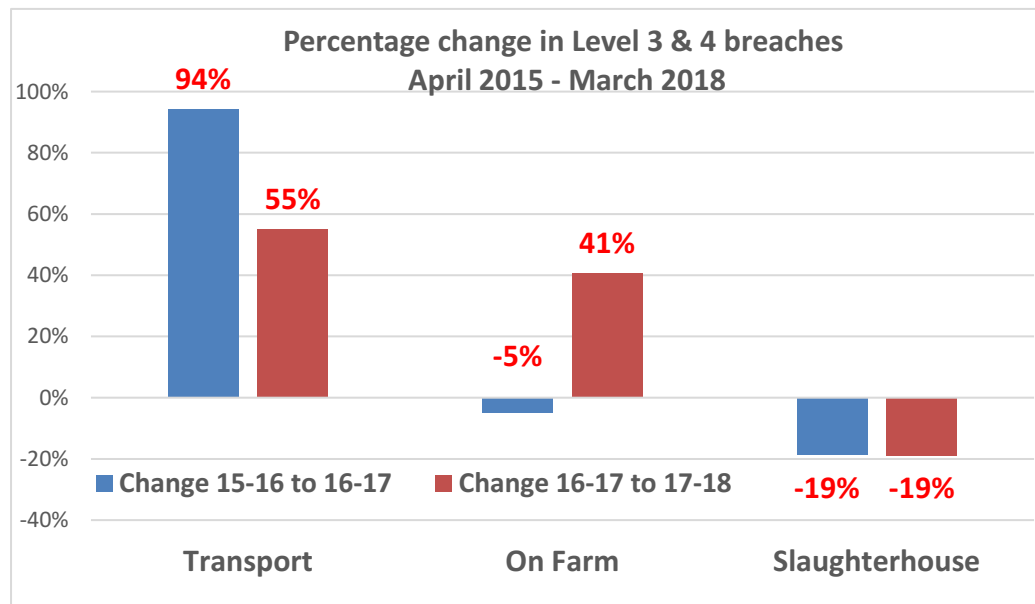

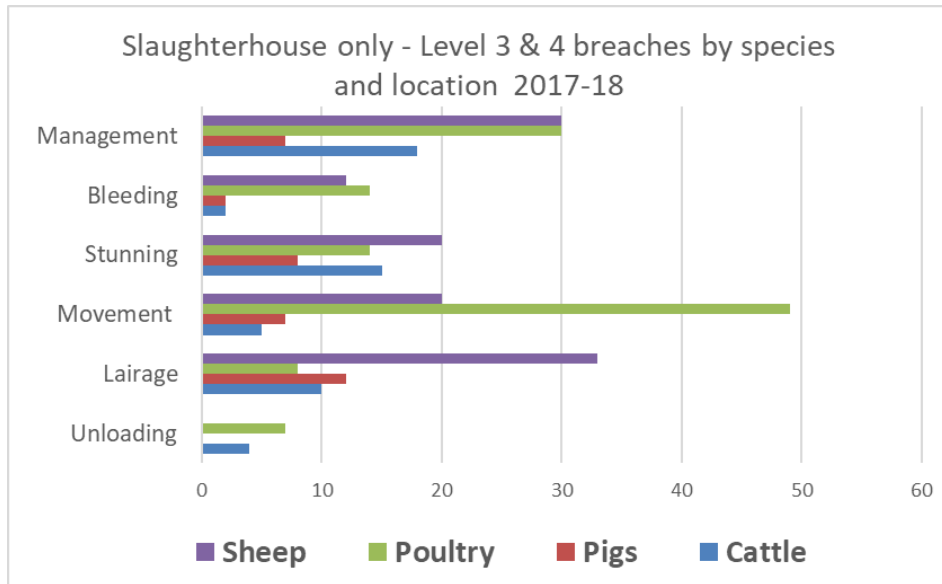

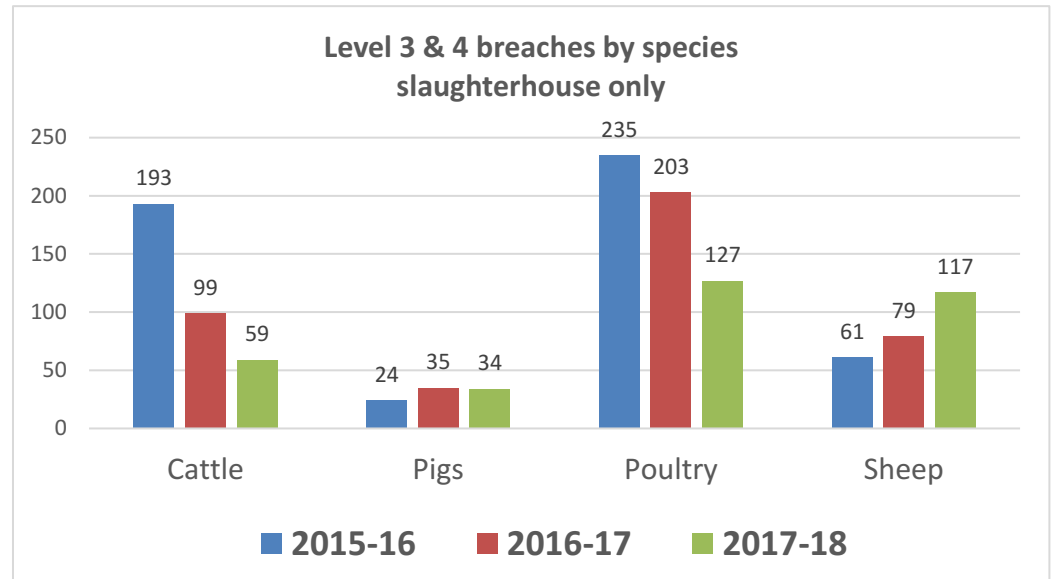
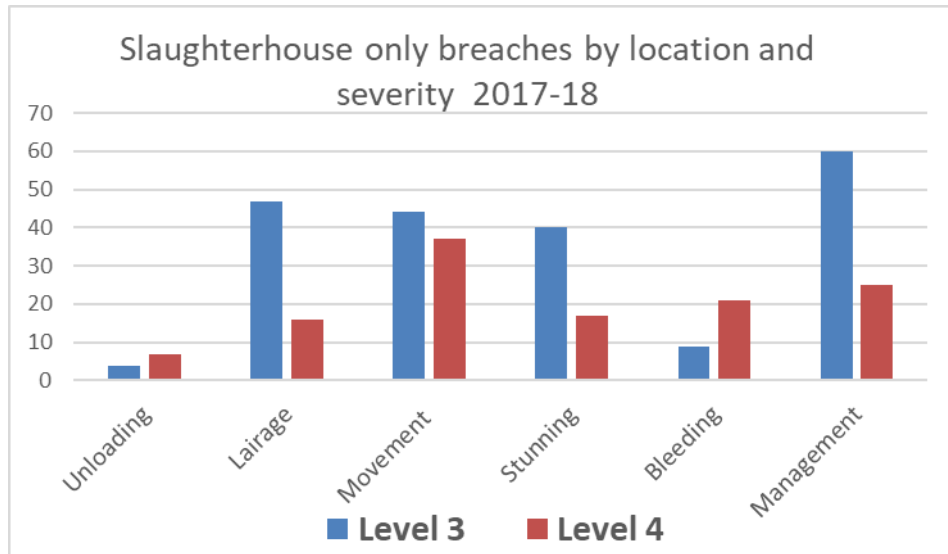

Levels of Non- Compliance severity:

Level 3 (MAJOR non-compliance) – Potential risk to welfare.

Level 4 (CRITICAL non-compliance) – Poses a serious and imminent risk to animal welfare.

Figures 1 – 4 highlight the declining trend in Slaughterhouse only for major and critical non-compliances over the past few years.

Figures 5 & 7 illustrate non-compliance in specific locations within the slaughterhouse.

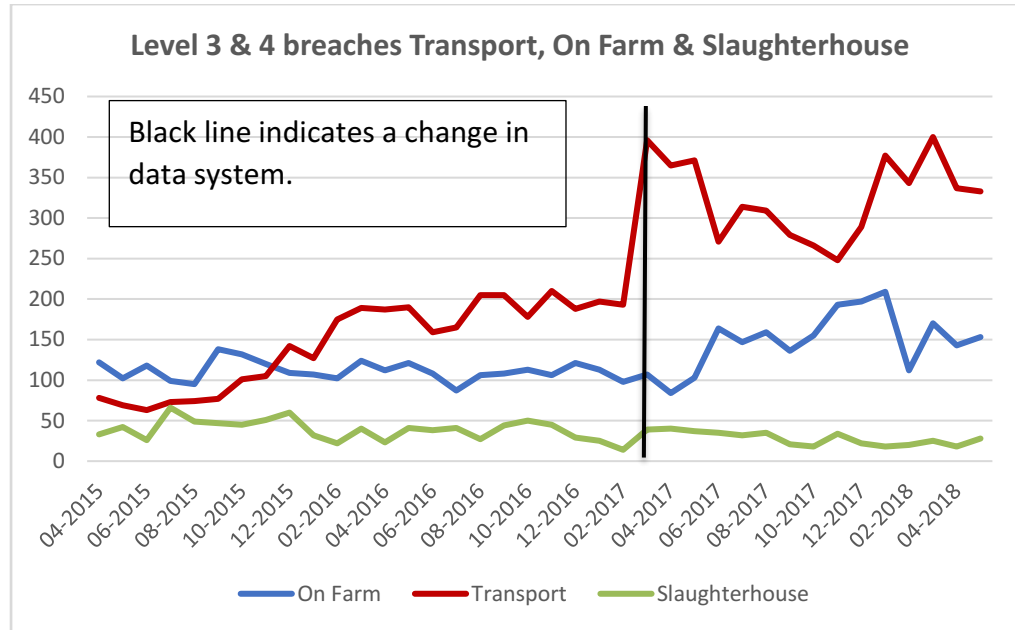
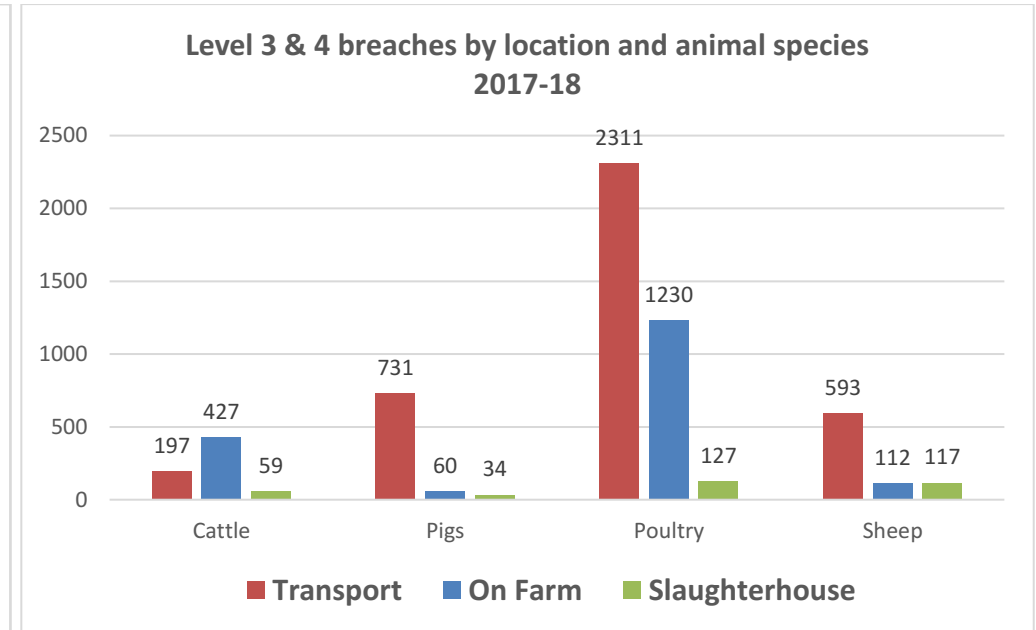


Figure 8. indicates a change in the FSA data system in March 2017 (Chronos), which caused an increase in recorded On-Farm and Transport non-compliance cases.

Figure 9. shows the high rate of Transport non-compliance cases is driven by transporting of poultry, accounting for almost 40% of all breaches from April 2017 to March 2018.
